


RAISES & PARAMETERS

WHAT ARE PARAMETERS & WHY DO THEY MATTER?

Parameters are the salary adjustments set by the Governor in every negotiation cycle for public employee unions in the state of Massachusetts.

Parameters effectively limit the raises our union can win in our contract negotiations. Massachusetts General Laws 150E, Section 7(c).

With inflation surging, the 2% parameters of the last cycle have failed to provide fair raises to Massachusetts public employees. Chart 1. Over-the-year percent change in CPI-U, Northeast region, October 2019– October 2022
